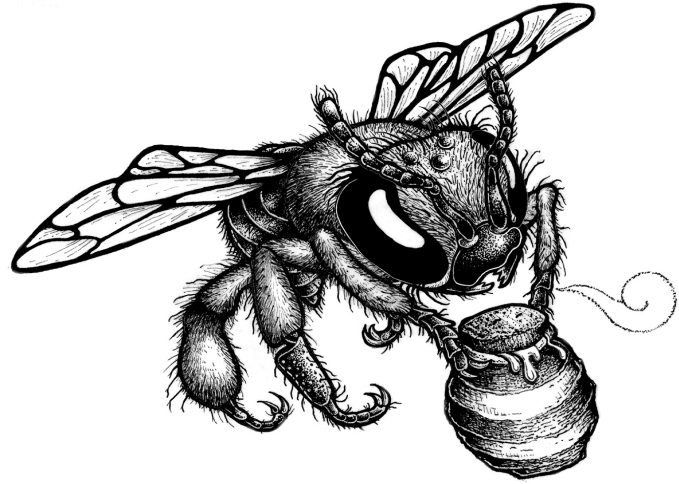

interdisciplinary (?) research field within social sciences

why/how mobilization & contentious politics occur,
their forms & dynamics, their discourses, the relation
with institutions & social norms, impact & outcomes

✧ collective behavior (Blumer, Smelser)

✧ rational choice (Olson)

✧ resource mobilization (McCharty and Zald)

✧ political process approach (McAdam, Meyer, Tarrow)

✧ 'new' social movements (Melucci, Touraine, della Porta)

epistemology? ethics?

- movement as ‘bearers of “new ways of seeing the world”’ (Cox and Flesher Forminaya 2009, 1) > respect the processes and reflexive practices leading to the creation of said knowledge
- activism is labor
- four questions: relevance, risk, power, accountability

#1 in relation to political activism

a. (lack of) privacy affects political activism/ 1

‘Merely organizing movements of dissent becomes difficult when the government is watching everything people are doing. But mass surveillance kills dissent in a deeper and more important place as well: **in the mind**, where the individual trains him- or herself to think only in line with what is expected and demanded’ (Greenwald, 2014: 177-8)

a. (lack of) privacy affects political activism /2

- a chilling effect ?
- asymmetrical power relation (Leister 2012)
- decline in ‘privacy-sensitive’ search on Google (Marthews & Tucker 2015)
- ‘spiral of silence’ in surveillance debate on social media (Hampton et al 2014)\
- UK tracked visitor to Wikileaks after Cablegate collecting IP addresses (Greenwald & Gallagher 2014)
- ‘Digital Citizenship and Surveillance Society’ project (Cardiff University)

- a elephant in the room (to be sacrificed in favor of visibility...?)



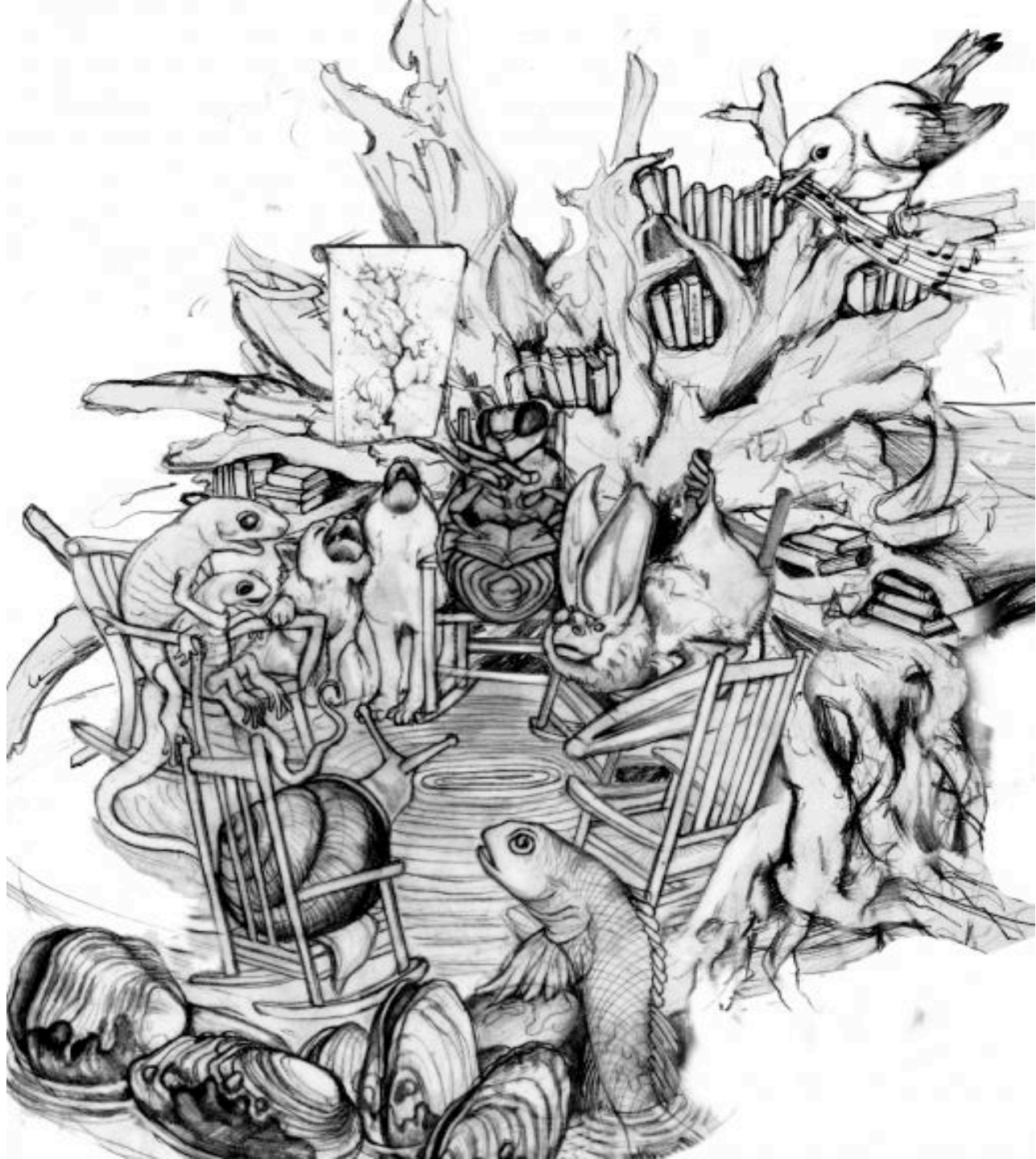
